




Anglican Parish of Kilmore, Broadford, Pyalong and Tallarook 6th Sunday of Easter 9th May 2021 Mother's Day

Sentence:

THE COLLECT

Loving God, your Son has chosen us and called us to be his friends: give us grace to keep his commandments, to love one another, and to bear fruit which will abide; through him who is the true vine, the source of all our life, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles chapter 10.44 – 48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, ⁴⁶ for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, ⁴⁷ 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' ⁴⁸ So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 98

Response – Sung/ Said: O sing to the Lord a new song

O sing to the Lord a new song: for he has done marvellous things; His right hand and his holy arm: they have got him the victory. The Lord has made known his salvation: he has revealed his just deliverance in the sight of the nations. **O sing to the Lord a new song**

He has remembered his mercy and faithfulness towards the house of Israel: and all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. Shout with joy to the Lord, all the earth: break into singing and make melody. Make melody to the Lord upon the harp: upon the harp and with the sounds of praise. With trumpets and with horns: cry out in triumph before the Lord, the king. **O sing to the Lord a new song**

Let the sea roar, and all that fills it: the good earth and those who live upon it. Let the rivers clap their hands: and let the mountains ring out together before the Lord; For he comes to judge the earth: he shall judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity. **O sing to the Lord a new song**

SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of John chapter 5.1 - 12

¹ Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. ² By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³ For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴ for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. ⁵ Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? ⁶ This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. ⁷ There are three that testify: 8 the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. 9 If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. 10 Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. ¹¹ And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. 12 Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, Alleluia! Alleluia! No one can have greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John chapter 15.9 – 17

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. ¹² 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.

¹⁶ You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷ I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Teach us to love each other as you love us, without regard creed or practise. Ever-loving God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

You came among us, born into a human family: hear our prayers for the people of this community, for our families, our friends and for ourselves. We pray for civic leaders and for all who advance the welfare of this community; for all in relationships that are bitter, violent or destructive; for the unemployed and all who are victims of economic greed. Teach us to love each other as you love us, welcoming both friend and stranger. Ever-loving God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

You lived among us, sharing with us our grief and pains: hear our prayers for the sick and all who suffer. We pray especially for Elaine Haddock, Belinda Shannon, Sharron de Battista, Jim Chatz, Barry Watts, Ray Daly, Val Watts, Beris Hannam, Gwen Bushell, Debbie Chilcott, Allan Rose, Beryl Kirby, Tom Scrivens, Norman Rose, Geoff Kirby, Bruce Radford, Fiona Mctier, Robert Whalley, Candice Pearce and Vince Fazio ... [parishioners are invited to add names of those they hold in

prayer.] We give thanks for where healing blessings have been received. We pray for all who spend their lives bringing care and comfort to others; for those in sadness, anxiety, despair or pain; for all who are forgotten, unheard, unvalued, unloved. Teach us to love each other as you love us, caring for both the vulnerable and strong. (pause) Ever-loving God, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

You laid down your life for those you loved: we remember your friends of every place and age. We remember those who have given their lives that others may live, the saints and martyrs and all your faithful people. We pray for those whose anniversary of death we remember this week: Rodney Heppell (10th); Elvie Walker, Brianna Hodges, Bill Beckingsale (11th); Alisha Becker (13th); Milton McLoughlan, Kenneth 'Snow' Chapman (14th); Bill Goulthorpe, Olgy Zechovsky (15th). Rest eternal grant to them O Lord, **and let light perpetual shine upon them.** (pause) Teach us to love each other as you love us, that following your commandments, we may be numbered among your friends and abide for ever in your love. (pause) Ever-loving God, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

In a time of silence let us pray for ourselves and those on our hearts and minds this day... (pause) God of love, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
