




# Anglican Parish of Kilmore, Broadford, Pyalong and Tallarook Trinity Sunday $30^{th} \text{ May } 2021$

## THE COLLECT

O blessed Trinity, in whom we know the Maker of all things, seen and unseen, the Saviour of all, both near and far: by your Spirit enable us so to worship your divine majesty, that with all the company of heaven we may magnify your glorious name, saying, Holy, holy, holy. Glory to you, O Lord most high. **Amen.** 

### FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of the prophet Isaiah, chapter 6.1 – 8 <sup>1</sup> In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. <sup>2</sup> Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. <sup>3</sup> And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' <sup>4</sup> The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. <sup>5</sup> And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!' <sup>6</sup> Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. <sup>7</sup> The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' <sup>8</sup> Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

## **RESPONSORIAL PSALM 29**

Response: Said: O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

<sup>1</sup> Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven: ascribe to the Lord glory and might.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name: O worship the Lord in the beauty of his holiness.<sup>3</sup> The voice of the Lord is upon the waters: the God of glory thunders, the Lord upon the great waters. <sup>4</sup> The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation: the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice. O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar-trees: the Lord breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon. <sup>6</sup> He makes them skip like a calf: Lebanon and Sirion like a young wild ox. <sup>7</sup> The voice of the Lord divides the lightning-flash: the voice of the Lord whirls

the sands of the desert, the Lord whirls the desert of Kadesh. O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.

<sup>8</sup> The voice of the Lord rends the terebinth trees, and strips bare the forests: in his temple all cry 'Glory.' <sup>9</sup> The Lord sits enthroned above the water-flood: the Lord sits enthroned as a king for ever. <sup>10</sup> The Lord will give strength to his people: the Lord will give to his people the blessing of peace. **O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.**

#### **SECOND READING**

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans chapter 8.12 - 17

<sup>12</sup> So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—<sup>13</sup> for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. <sup>15</sup> For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' <sup>16</sup> it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, <sup>17</sup> and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.** *Silence may follow each reading.*

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John, chapter 3.1 - 17

# Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>1</sup> Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. <sup>2</sup> He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' <sup>3</sup> Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' <sup>4</sup> Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' <sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. <sup>6</sup> What is born of

the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup> Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." <sup>8</sup> The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' <sup>9</sup> Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' <sup>10</sup> Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? <sup>11</sup> 'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup> If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? <sup>13</sup> No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. <sup>14</sup> And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup> that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. <sup>16</sup> 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. <sup>17</sup> 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

we live and work, learn and play. Unite us in a community of love and care, that all your people may live together in safety, dignity and hope. Holy God, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Eternal God, we give you thanks for all who inspire us with their courage and for all who bring comfort to those in distress. We pray for all your children in need: for the friendless, the despairing and those who mourn; for all who are in pain, for the sick and for the dying. Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers.

Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
