THE COLLECT

Ever-living God, increase in us your gift of faith, that, forsaking sin and all that hinders us, we may run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of prophet Jeremiah chapter 23.23 - 29

²³ Am I a God nearby, says the Lord, and not a God far off? ²⁴ Who can hide in secret places so that I cannot see them? says the Lord. Do I not fill heaven and earth? says the Lord. ²⁵ I have heard what the prophets have said who prophesy lies in my name, saying, 'I have dreamed, I have dreamed!' ²⁶ How long? Will the hearts of the prophets ever turn back—those who prophesy lies, and who prophesy the deceit of their own heart? ²⁷ They plan to make my people forget my name by their dreams that they tell one another, just as their ancestors forgot my name for Baal. ²⁸ Let the prophet who has a dream tell the dream, but let the one who has my word speak my word faithfully. What has straw in common with wheat? says the Lord. ²⁹ Is not my word like fire, says the Lord, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 82

⁴ 'Rescue the poor and needy: and save them from the hands of the wicked. Arise, O God, and judge the earth

⁵ 'They do not know, they do not understand, they walk about in darkness: all the foundations of the earth are shaken. ⁶ 'Therefore I say, "Though you are gods: and all of you children of the Most High, ⁷ "Nevertheless you shall die like a mortal: and fall like one of the princes." ⁸ Arise, O God, and judge the earth: for you shall take all nations as your possession. **Arise, O God, and judge the earth**

SECOND READING

A reading from letter to the Hebrews Chapter 11.29 - 12.2

²⁹ By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned.³⁰ By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. ³¹ By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace. ³² And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—³³ who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴ quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. 35 Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶ Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷ They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented— ³⁸ of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground. ³⁹ Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰ since God had provided something better so that they would not, without us, be made perfect. 12¹ Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia, Alleluia!

My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia! Alleluia!

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Chapter 12.49 – 59

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴⁹ 'I came to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already kindled!
⁵⁰ I have a baptism with which to be baptized, and what stress I am under until it is completed! ⁵¹ Do you think that I have come to bring peace to the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division! ⁵² From now on, five in one household will be divided,

three against two and two against three; ⁵³ they will be divided: father against son and son against father, mother against daughter and daughter against mother, mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and daughter-in-law against mother-inlaw.' ⁵⁴ He also said to the crowds, 'When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, "It is going to rain"; and so it happens. ⁵⁵ And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, "There will be scorching heat"; and it happens. ⁵⁶ You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time? ⁵⁷ 'And why do you not judge for yourselves what is right? ⁵⁸ Thus, when you go with your accuser before a magistrate, on the way make an effort to settle the case, or you may be dragged before the judge, and the judge hand you over to the officer, and the officer throw you in prison. ⁵⁹ I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the very last penny.'

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Let us pray for church and the world.

Faithful God, you hear our cries and answer when we call on you: give us faith to believe that with you all things are possible. You created a world of beauty and promise, but we have made places of ugliness and despair: hear our prayers for the preservation of the earth. We pray for careful stewardship of the resources of the earth, for reverence and respect for its wonder and diversity, that we may live in harmony with the created world. God of mercy, **hear our prayer**.

Faithful God, you have shown us ways of justice and righteousness, but we have chosen paths of violence and greed: hear our prayers for the nations of the world. Bring peace to your warring world, for the people of Ukraine, Russia, Syria, Palestine, Israel, Afghanistan, Yemen, Somalia, Sri Lanka and Myanmar that peace and justice may increase. We pray for an end to bloodshed and oppression, for an equitable sharing of the good gifts of the earth, that we may live together in peace and prosperity. God of mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Faithful God, you have offered us gifts of redemption and life, but we have clung to old ways of sin and death: hear our prayers for your church and its mission. We pray for Philip, our Archbishop and Clarence, our Bishop, all clergy and those minister in your church. We pray for unity of heart and purpose between Christians, for discernment and understanding of your word, that we may faithfully proclaim your gospel in the world. God of mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Faithful God, you rescue the weak and save those in destress, but we have abandoned the vulnerable and neglected those in need: hear our prayers for the people of this community. We pray for welcome for the stranger and acceptance for the outsider, for assistance for the hungry, the homeless and those without work, those who suffer addiction and abuse, that we may learn to love and care for each other. God of mercy, **hear our prayer**.

Faithful God, you are generous and loving to all your people, but we have been selfish and uncaring towards each other: hear our prayers for all who suffer.
