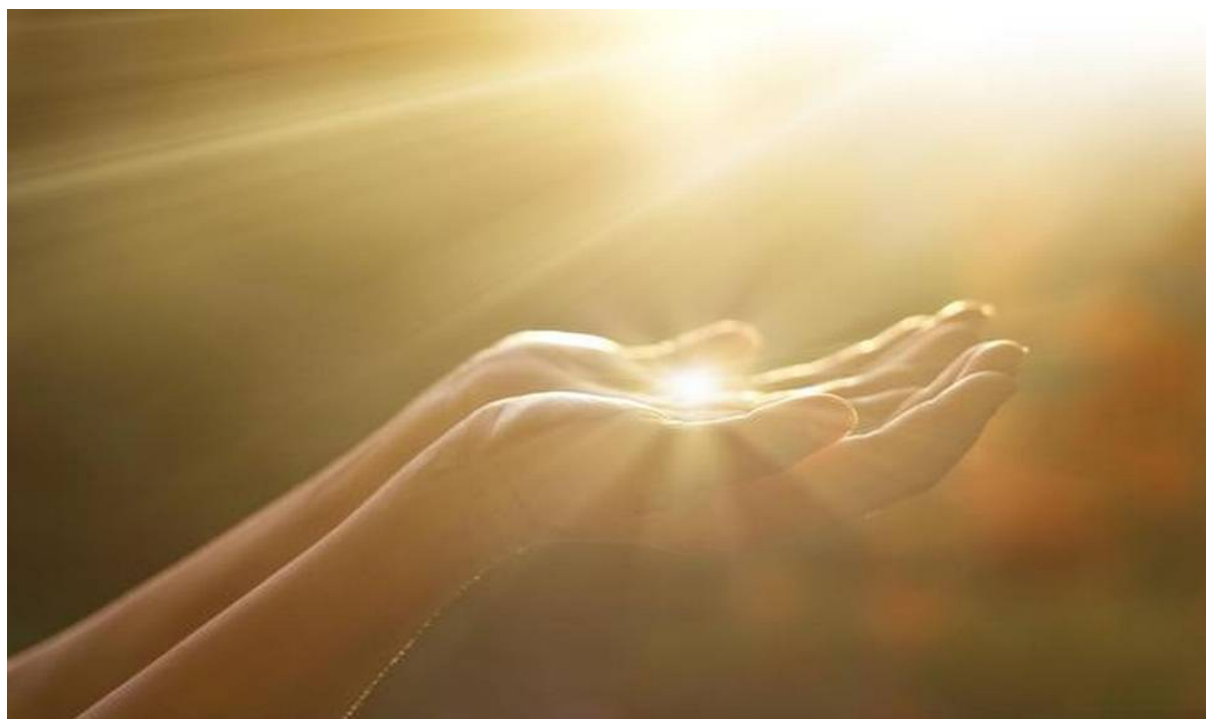

THE COLLECT

Undaunted you seek the lost, O God, exultant you bring home the found: touch our hearts with grateful wonder at the tenderness of your forbearing love; grant us delight in the mercy that has found us; and bring all to rejoice at the feast of forgiven sinners. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ exchanged the glory of a heavenly throne for the form of a servant, we thank you that you have given Elizabeth our Queen a heart to serve her people, and have kept her devoted in this service beyond all who were before her: encourage us by her example to serve one another, and to seek the common good, until you call us all to reign with Christ in your eternal kingdom. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of prophet Jeremiah chapter 4.11 – 12, 22 – 28

¹¹ At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert towards my poor people, not to winnow or cleanse— ¹² a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgement against them. ²² ‘For my people are foolish, they do not know me; they are stupid children, they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil, but do not know how to do good.’ ²³ I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light. ²⁴ I looked on the mountains, and lo, they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro. ²⁵ I looked, and lo, there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled. ²⁶ I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the Lord, before his fierce anger. ²⁷ For thus says the Lord: The whole land shall be a desolation; yet I will not make a full end. ²⁸ Because of this the earth shall mourn, and the heavens above grow black; for I have spoken, I have purposed; I have not relented nor will I turn back.

Hear the word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 14

Response: The just will live in the presence of the Lord.

¹ Fools have said in their hearts ‘There is no God’: they have all become vile and abominable in their doings, there is not one that does good. ² The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of Adam: to see if there were any who would act wisely and seek after God. ³ But they have all turned out of the way, they have all alike become corrupt: there is none that does good, no not one. **The just will live in the presence of the Lord.**

⁴ Are all the evildoers devoid of understanding: who eat up my people as they eat bread, and do not pray to the Lord? ⁵ They shall be struck with terror: for God is with the company of the righteous. ⁶ Though they frustrate the poor in their hopes: surely the Lord is their refuge. ⁷ O that deliverance for Israel might come forth from Zion: when the Lord turns again the fortunes of his people, then shall Jacob rejoice and Israel be glad. **The just will live in the presence of the Lord.**

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul’s first letter to Timothy Chapter 1.1 – 2, 12 – 19a

¹ Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope, ² To Timothy, my loyal child in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹² I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service,¹³ even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵ The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. ¹⁶ But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life.¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen. ¹⁸ I am giving you these instructions, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies made earlier about you, so that by following them you may fight the good fight, ¹⁹ having faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have suffered shipwreck in the faith;

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

God was in Christ, to reconcile the world to himself; and the Good News of reconciliation he has entrusted to us. Alleluia! **Alleluia!**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Chapter 15.1 – 10
Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹ Now all the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, ‘This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.’ ³ So he told them this parable: ⁴ ‘Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵ When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, “Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.” ⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who need no repentance. ⁸ ‘Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbours, saying, “Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.” ¹⁰ Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.’

For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Teach us together to share your good news in the world. God of mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Loving God, we give you thanks that you have shown us your ways of love and acceptance: look in mercy on our community. We pray for all with whom we share our lives: for our families, our friends and those with whom we work; for the hungry and the homeless of this community; for those who have been stripped of their dignity and hope. Teach us to be a community where love and care are found. God of mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Loving God, we give you thanks that you seek out the lost and care for the lonely, the weak and the despised: look in mercy on those who suffer, for those who has lost everything in the recent fires. We pray for all who are in need: for those in places of fear, loneliness, grief or pain; for those whose minds are troubled, whose spirits are sad, whose bodies hurt; for the sick and the dying, those whom we name and those known only to you.
