Sentence:

THE COLLECT

O God, you have made heaven and earth and all that is good: help us to delight in simple things and to rejoice always in the richness of your bounty; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the second Book of Kings Chapter 5.1 - 3, 7 - 15c

¹ Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favour with his master, because by him the Lord had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. ² Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. 3 She said to her mistress, 'If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy.' ⁷ When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, 'Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me.' 8 But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, 'Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel.' 9 So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. 10 Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, 'Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean.' 11 But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, 'I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! 12 Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?' He turned and went away in a rage. 13 But his servants approached and said to him, 'Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, "Wash, and be clean"?' 14 So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean. 15 Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, 'Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel; please accept a present from your servant.'

Hear the word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm 66.1 - 11

Response: Let all the earth cry out in joy

- ¹ O shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing to the honour of his name, and give him glory as his praise. ² Say to God 'How fearful are your works: because of your great might your enemies shall cower before you.' ³ All the earth shall worship you: and sing to you, and sing praises to your name. ⁴ Come then and see what God has done: how terrible are his dealings with the children of Adam. Let all the earth cry out in joy
- ⁵ He turned the sea into dry land, they crossed the river on foot: then were we joyful because of him. ⁶ By his power he rules for ever, his eyes keep watch on the nations: and rebels shall never rise against him. ⁷ O bless our God, you peoples: and cause his praises to resound, ⁸ Who has held our souls in life: who has not suffered our feet to slip. **Let all the earth cry out in joy**
- ⁹ For you have proved us, O God: you have tried us as silver is tried. ¹⁰ You brought us into the net: you laid sharp torment on our loins. ¹¹ You let our enemies ride over our heads, we went through fire and water: but you brought us out into a place of liberty. Let all the earth cry out in joy

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy Chapter 2.8 – 15

⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel, ⁹ for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹ The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; ¹² if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; ¹³ if we are faithless, he remains faithful— for he cannot deny himself. ¹⁴ Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. ¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

¹¹ On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, ¹³ they called out, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' ¹⁴ When he saw them, he said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶ He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus asked, 'Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸ Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' ¹⁹ Then he said to him, 'Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.'

We pray for all who are leaders in your church, for Philip, our Archbishop, Clarence, our Bishop; for pastors and teachers, for all who worship or minister in this parish. Teach us to entrust our lives to you to proclaim to others the good news of your grace. Bountiful God, for all your good gifts to us, we give you thanks and praise.

You have given us the joy of human friendship and shown us your way of love: hear our prayers for this community and all with whom our lives are bound. We pray for those who are strangers or outsiders, the neglected and abused; for ourselves and each other and all whom we love. Teach us to be a welcoming community, so that all may find here a place of acceptance. Bountiful God, for all your good gifts to us, we give you thanks and praise.

You desire wholeness for your people and you have mercy when we ask for healing: hear our prayers for those who suffer, for all in trouble or need. We pray for all whom we marginalize, for AIDS sufferers, the elderly, the mentally ill; for the sick and the dying and all who are in pain.
