

THE COLLECT

Lord, tireless guardian of your people, teach us to rely, day and night, on your care. Drive us to seek your justice and your help, and support our prayer lest we grow weary, for in you alone is our strength. We make our prayer through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of prophet Jeremiah Chapter 31.27 - 34

²⁷ The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will sow the house of Israel and the house of Judah with the seed of humans and the seed of animals. ²⁸ And just as I have watched over them to pluck up and break down, to overthrow, destroy, and bring evil, so I will watch over them to build and to plant, says the Lord . ²⁹ In those days they shall no longer say: 'The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge.' ³⁰ But all shall die for their own sins; the teeth of everyone who eats sour grapes shall be set on edge. ³¹ The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³² It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt-a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. ³³ But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴ No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Responsorial Psalm 119.97 – 104

Response: Lord, I love your commands

⁹⁷ Lord, how I love your law: it is my meditation all the day long. ⁹⁸ Your commandments have made me wiser than my enemies: for they remain with me for ever. ⁹⁹ I have more understanding than all my teachers: for I study your commands. ¹⁰⁰ I am wiser than the aged: because I have kept your precepts. Lord, I love your commands

¹⁰¹ I have held back my feet from every evil path: that I might keep your word;
¹⁰² I have not turned aside from your judgements: for you yourself are my teacher.
¹⁰³ How sweet are your words to my tongue: sweeter than honey to my mouth.
¹⁰⁴ Through your precepts I get understanding: therefore I hate all lying ways.

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy Chapter 3.10 to Chapter 4.5

3¹⁰ Now you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, ¹¹ my persecutions, and my suffering the things that happened to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. What persecutions I endured! Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them. ¹² Indeed, all who want to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted. ¹³ But wicked people and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving others and being deceived. ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. 4¹ In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ² proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. ³ For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, ⁴ and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵ As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Chapter 18.1 - 14

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹ Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart.² He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. ³ In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." ⁴ For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." ⁶ And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. 7 And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? 8 I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?' 9 He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: 10 'Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax-collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. ¹² I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." ¹³ But the tax-collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Let us pray for the world and the church.

Loving God, you teach us to bring our needs to you in prayers and you come to our help when we cry to you: hear our prayers for the world and for your church.

We pray for the peoples of every land: especially for the peoples of Ukraine, Russia, Syria, Palestine, Israel, Afghanistan, Yemen, Iran, Somalia, Sri Lanka and Myanmar; for all who face starvation or disease, for those in the midst of natural disasters suffering its effects and the need for recovery; for the homeless and the destitute; for all in position of authority and for those who work for justice and peace. When we pray to you for peace, but fail to see our own aggression, when we pray for justice, but we do not acknowledge our own greed, God be merciful to us, and, in your mercy, **hear our prayer**. We pray for this country and for all who have made Australia their home: for those who suffer the effects of the floods and the uncertainty for the future; for the indigenous peoples of this land; for all who endure persecution or discrimination. When we seek reconciliation, but we do not apologise for the past wrongs, when we ask others for forgiveness, but we are unforgiving and judgmental, God be merciful to us, and, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for the worldwide church, its clergy and people: for Philip, our Archbishop, Clarence, our Bishop; for all who worship or minister in this parish; for communities of faith in places of danger and isolation; for evangelist and preachers and for all who proclaim your good news. When we come to you for blessing, but we disregard your law, when we speak to others of your love, but our lives are cold and mean, God be merciful to us, and, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We pray for those with whom we share our lives and for all whom we love: for those without work and those overburdened with responsibility and the devastation of the floods in Mitchell Shire and Victoria; for all who work to make this community a more welcoming and caring place. When we condemn the faults of others, but we cannot see our own, when we accept the love of others, but we are ungenerous and unkind, God be merciful to us, and, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We pray for all in trouble or distress, all in need of your comforting presence: for the infirm and those who can no longer care for themselves; for those who are in grief or in anguish, for the sick and for the dying. When we cry to you for help, but we turn away from those in need, when we can meet the needs of others, but we deny our neediness, (pause) God be merciful to us, and, in your mercy, **hear our prayer**.
