FIRST READING

SCHCAN PARISH OF KILL

WITH BROADFORD, TALLAROOF & PYALONG

A reading from the Book of Deuteronomy Chapter 26.1 - 11

¹ When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it,² you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. ³ You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your

God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us.' ⁴ When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, ⁵ you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. ⁶ When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, ⁷ we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. ⁸ The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; ⁹ and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. ¹⁰ So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. ¹¹ Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 91.1 – 2, 9 – 16

Said/ Sung: God in whom I trust.

¹ Those who dwell in the shelter of the Most High: who abide under the shadow of the Almighty, ² They will say to the Lord 'You are my refuge and my stronghold: my God in whom I trust.' ⁹ The Lord himself is your refuge: you have made the Most High your stronghold. ¹⁰ Therefore no harm will befall you: nor will any scourge come near your tent. ¹¹ For he will command his angels: to keep you in all your ways. **God in whom I trust.**

¹² They will bear you up in their hands: lest you dash your foot against a stone. ¹³ You will tread on the lion and the adder: the young lion and the serpent you will trample under foot. ¹⁴ 'You have set your love upon me,' says the Lord, 'and therefore I will deliver you: I will lift you out of danger, because you have known my name. ¹⁵ 'When you call upon me I will answer you: I will be with you in trouble, I will rescue you and bring you to honour. ¹⁶ 'With long life I will satisfy you: and fill you with my salvation.' **God in whom I trust.**

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans Chapter 10.4 - 13

⁴ For Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes. ⁵ Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that 'the person who does these things will live by them.' ⁶ But the righteousness that comes from faith says, 'Do not say in your heart, "Who will ascend into heaven?"'(that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷ 'or "Who will descend into the abyss?" ' (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? 'The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹ because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. ¹¹ The scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. ¹³ For, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Chapter 4.1 - 15

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹ Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. ³ The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread.' ⁴ Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "One does not live by bread alone." ' ⁵ Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. ⁶ And the devil said to him, 'To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. ⁷ If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' ⁸ Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." '9 Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, ¹⁰ for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you", ¹¹ and "On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." '¹² Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." '¹³ When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time. ¹⁴ Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. ¹⁵ He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

Long ago you brought your people out of slavery to freedom: hear the cries of your people today who are held in the bondage of oppression, persecution or war. We pray for the people of Ukraine, Russia, Myanmar, Syria, Yemen; for all who struggle with the uncertainty and fear of the current Covid pandemic. God in whom we trust and hope, **save us when we call on you.**

You led your people though a desert to a land flowing with milk and honey: hear the cries of your people today who are hungry and homeless, those who suffer the effects of the recent floods in New South Wales and Queensland; all for whom daily life is a struggle for survival. God in whom we trust and hope, **save us when we call on you.**

With a mighty hand and outstretched am you led your people out of Egypt: hear the cries of those today who have lost their way, all who wander without direction, purpose or hope in their lives. God in whom we trust and hope, **save us when we call on you.**

With arms outstretched upon the cross you brought redemption to your people: hear the cries of those today who long to hear your message of forgiveness, reconciliation and love. God in whom we trust and hope, **save us when we call on you.**

You led your Son out into a desert to prepare for his earthly ministry: hear the prayers for all who seek, this Lent, to understand the meaning of their baptism, and equip them to carry your gospel to our broken world. We pray for Philip, our Archbishop and Clarence, our Bishop. God in whom we trust and hope, **save us when we call on you.**

You sent your angels to minister to your Son in the desert; hear the cries of those today who experience pain, loneliness, despair or grief, all who are in need of your tenderness and care. We pray especially for Elaine Haddock, Belinda Shannon, Sharron de Battista, Jim Chatz, Barry Watts, Ray Daly, Val Watts, Gwen Bushell, Debbie Chilcott, Beryl Kirby, Tom Scrivens, Geoff Kirby, Fiona Mctier, Robert Whalley, Candice Pearce, Russel Taylor, Kate Jessup, David Valentine, Margaret Taylor, Jeanne Jones, Rebecca Wallis, and Vince Fazio ... You led your chosen people from a place of slavery into the land of their inheritance: we remember those who have died in the faith and come into the inheritance you promise to all who love you. Strengthen us to turn away from evil and guide us safely through the wilderness of sin and death, that, with your pilgrim people of every age, we may enter the Promise Land of your eternal presence. Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
