

Invitation to Confession

Christ the Son of God has been revealed as a light to the nations. *Silence may be kept.*

Let us bring our darkness to his light, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

THE COLLECT

O God, in the transfiguration of your Son you confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the witness of Moses and Elijah, and in the voice from the cloud you foreshadowed our adoption as your children: make us, with Christ, heirs of your glory, and bring us to enjoy its fullness; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Exodus Chapter 24.12 - 18

¹² The LORD said to Moses, 'Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.' ¹³So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. ¹⁴To the elders he had said, 'Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.' ¹⁵ Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. ¹⁶The glory of the LORD settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. ¹⁷Now the appearance of the glory of the LORD was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. ¹⁸Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

² The kings of the earth rise up and the rulers conspire together: against the Lord and against his anointed, saying, ³ 'Let us break their bonds asunder: let us throw off their chains from us.' ⁴ He that dwells in heaven shall laugh them to scorn: the Lord will hold them in derision. Lord let us behold your glory

⁵ Then will he speak to them in his wrath, and terrify them in his fury: 'I, the Lord, have set up my king on Zion my holy hill.' ⁶ I will announce the Lord's decree, that which he has spoken: 'You are my son, this day have I begotten you. ⁷ 'Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for your inheritance: the uttermost parts of the earth for your possession. **Lord let us behold your glory**

SECOND READING

A reading from the Second Letter of Peter Chapter 1.16 - 21

¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.' ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, ²¹ because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew Chapter 17.1 - 9

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹ Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. ² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³ Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. ⁴ Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' ⁵ While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!' ⁶When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. ⁷But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.' ⁸And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. ⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

For the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ**

On Mount Sinai you glory overshadowed Moses and you gave him your holy law: may your world today receive your wisdom and word, that nations may dwell in peace and be governed for the good of all. We pray for the peoples of Ukraine, Russia, Syria, Palestine, Israel, Afghanistan, Yemen, Iran, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Myanmar and with all who long for peace. We pray especially for the people of Syria and Turkiye suffering the devastation of the earthquake. God of mercy, hear our prayer.

On the mountain of the transfiguration, you revealed Christ's glory and majesty: may your church today reveal your glory to others, that your gospel may be proclaimed in all the world. We pray for your worldwide church, for the churches of this land, for Philip our Archbishop, and Clarence our Bishop and for all who serve you in this place. God of mercy, **hear our prayer.**

On the mountain-top Peter, James and John trembled in the presence of your glory: may the communities in which we live glimpse the splendor of your glory, that we may live in relationships which reflect your transfiguring love. God of mercy, hear our prayer.

Your beloved Son was clothed in glory, but he suffered rejection, pain and death: may your beloved sons and daughters who suffer today be clothed in your transforming grace, that they may receive consolation in their sorrow and healing in their pain.
