FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of Genesis Chapter 12.1 - 4a

¹ Now the Lord said to Abram, 'Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ² I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. ³ I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.' ⁴ So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 121

Response: Our help comes from the Lord.

¹ I lift up my eyes to the hills: but where shall I find help? ² My help comes from the Lord: who has made heaven and earth. ³ He will not suffer your foot to stumble: and he who watches over you will not sleep. ⁴ Be sure he who has charge of Israel: will neither slumber nor sleep. **Our help comes from the Lord.**

⁵ The Lord himself is your keeper: the Lord is your defence upon your right hand; ⁶ The sun shall not strike you by day: nor shall the moon by night. ⁷ The Lord will defend you from all evil: it is he who will guard your life. ⁸ The Lord will defend your going out and your coming in: from this time forward for evermore. **Our help comes from the Lord.**

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans Chapter 4.1 - 5, 13 - 17

¹ What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? ² For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. ³ For what does the scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.' ⁴ Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. ⁵ But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness. ¹³ For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴ If it is the

adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵ For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. ¹⁶ For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷ as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Chapter 3.1 - 17

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹ Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ² He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' ³ Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' 4 Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' ⁵ Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. 6 What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7 Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." 8 The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' 9 Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' 10 Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? ¹¹ 'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹² If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴ And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶ 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. ¹⁷ 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

We pray especially for the people of Syria and Turkiye suffering the devastation of the earthquake and for New Zealand as they recover from the devastation of the cyclone. Teach us your ways of justice, that violence and oppression may cease, and all nations know the blessings of freedom and peace. Loving God, in your mercy, **hear our prayer**.

We give you thanks that in your love for us you sent your Son to bring salvation to the world. We pray for your church, for all with responsibility of leadership and administration, for Archbishop, Philip, our metropolitan and Clarence, our Bishop, for all who serve you in this place. Teach us to trust in your word, that in faith we may follow where you lead and bring to fruition your purpose in our lives. Loving God, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We give you thanks that in your love for us you reach out to heal the sick, befriend the lonely and comfort the sad. We pray for all who are in trouble or distress, for those whose lives are cold and bleak, for those who have been affected by the spread of the worldwide corona virus infection, for those who mourn the loss of loved ones, for the sick, the dying and all who care for them. The Commandments

Hear the commandments which God has given to his people and take them to heart. (SILENCE)

I am the Lord your God; you shall have no other gods but me. **Amen. Lord, have mercy.** You shall not make an idol of anything and worship it. **Amen. You shall not covet the possessions of others. **Amen. Lord, have mercy.**

Let us then ask for mercy, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, and in what we have failed to do: we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The priest says:

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE COLLECT

God of mercy, you are full of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in mercy, and always ready to forgive: grant us grace to renounce all evil and to cling to Christ, that in every way we may prove to be your loving children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

If you do not wish to share in the Lord's Supper, you are welcome to receive a blessing.
