



### FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Proverbs chapter 8.1 - 4, 22 - 31

¹ Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice? ² On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; ³ beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: ⁴ 'To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. ²² The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. ²³ Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. ²⁴ When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. ²⁵ Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth— ²⁶ when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. ²⁷ When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, ²ð when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, ²ð when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, ³ð then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, ³¹ rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

## **RESPONSORIAL PSALM: 8**

<sup>1</sup> O Lord our Governor: how glorious is your name in all the earth! <sup>2</sup> Your majesty above the heavens is yet recounted: by the mouths of babes and sucklings. <sup>3</sup> You have founded a strong defence against your adversaries: to quell the enemy and the avenger. <sup>4</sup> When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers: the moon and the stars which you have set in order, <sup>5</sup> What are we, that you should be mindful of us: what are we, that you should care for us? **O Lord, our God, how glorious is your name!** 

<sup>6</sup> Yet you have made us little less than gods: and have crowned us with glory and honour. <sup>7</sup> You have given us dominion over your handiwork: and have put all things in subjection beneath our feet, <sup>8</sup> All sheep and oxen: and all the creatures of the field, <sup>9</sup> The birds of the air and the fish of the sea: and everything that moves in the pathways of the great waters. <sup>10</sup> O Lord our Governor: how glorious is your name in all the earth! **O Lord, our God, how glorious is your name!**

#### SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans chapter 5.1 - 5

<sup>1</sup> Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup> through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. <sup>3</sup> And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup> and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup> and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

#### PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Wisdom and Word of God, created by God at the beginning of time, you chose to dwell with the children of humanity: hear our prayers for your worldwide church. We pray for the church in places where it is persecuted or ignored; for church leaders, especially for Philip our Archbishop; for Clarence, our bishop and all who minister or serve in your name. Guard and strengthen your servant, Elizabeth the Queen, that she may put her trust in you and seek your honour and glory. Unite your people in a community of faith, that we may grow in the understanding of your word and proclaim your gospel in all the world. God of glory, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Spirit of God, you hovered over the waters of creation, and you are with us today, bringing love and peace: hear our prayers for those whose lives we share. We pray for those in society who are disadvantaged or neglected; for our families and our friends, for each other and for ourselves. Unite your people in a community of love, that we may support the weak, care for the vulnerable and welcome the outsiders in our midst. God of glory, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.** 

Three-in-one God, you give life to your people, comforting us in our sorrows and sustaining us in our needs: hear our prayers for all who suffer. We pray for the grief-stricken, the broken-hearted and all in despair; for those who are overworked and for those with no work; for the sick and for all who are close to death. Lambeth Conference: Around once every 10 years, since 1867, the Archbishops of Canterbury have invited the bishops of the Anglican Communion to gather for prayer, worship, consultation, fellowship and resourcing. The next Lambeth Conference will take place in July and August this year at the University of Kent in Canterbury, under the theme "God's Church for God's World: walking, listening and witnessing together".

A seasonal Prayer Diary has been produced to help people pray for the success of this year's Lambeth Conference. It is part of a Prayer Journey in which people are also being invited to send in prayers, which will be displayed on a prayer wall to encourage those attending the conference. In addition, a special collect has been written to help people to pray for the Lambeth Conference:
