FIRST READING

Exodus 32.1-14

A reading from the book of Exodus

When the people saw that Moses was so long in coming down from the mountain, they gathered round Aaron and said, ‘Come, make us gods who will go before us. As for this fellow Moses who brought us up out of Egypt, we don’t know what has happened to him.’ Aaron answered them, ‘Take off the gold earrings that your wives, your sons and your daughters are wearing, and bring them to me.’ So all the people took off their earrings and brought them to Aaron. He took what they handed him and made it into an idol cast in the shape of a calf, fashioning it with a tool. Then they said, ‘These are your gods, Israel, who brought you up out of Egypt.’ When Aaron saw this, he built an altar in front of the calf and announced, ‘Tomorrow there will be a festival to the Lord.’

So the next day the people rose early and sacrificed burnt offerings and presented fellowship offerings. Afterwards they sat down to eat and drink and got up to indulge in revelry. Then the Lord said to Moses, ‘Go down, because your people, whom you brought up out of Egypt, have become corrupt. They have been quick to turn away from what I commanded them and have made themselves an idol cast in the shape of a calf. They have bowed down to it and sacrificed to it and have said, “These are your gods, Israel, who brought you up out of Egypt.”’ ‘I have seen these people,’ the Lord said to Moses, ‘and they are a stiff-necked people. Now leave me alone so that my anger may burn against them and that I may destroy them. Then I will make you into a great nation.’ But Moses sought the favour of the Lord his God. ‘Lord,’ he said, ‘why should your anger burn against your people, whom you brought out of Egypt with great power and a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, “It was with evil intent that he brought them out, to kill them in the mountains and to wipe them off the face of the earth”? Turn from your fierce anger; relent and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember your servants Abraham, Isaac and Israel, to whom you swore by your own self: “I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and I will give your descendants all this land I promised them, and it will be their inheritance for ever.”’ Then the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

GOSPEL

Matthew 22. 1-14

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus spoke to the people again in parables, saying: ‘The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his servants to those who had been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come. ‘Then he sent some more servants and said, “Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet.” ‘But they paid no attention and went off – one to his field, another to his business. The rest seized his servants, ill-treated them and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his army and destroyed those murderers and burned their city. ‘Then he said to his servants, “The wedding banquet is ready, but those I invited did not deserve to come. So go to the street corners and invite to the banquet anyone you find.” So the servants went out into the streets and gathered all the people they could find, the bad as well as the good, and the wedding hall was filled with guests. ‘But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing wedding clothes. He asked, “How did you get in here without wedding clothes, friend?” The man was speechless. ‘Then the king told the attendants, “Tie him hand and foot, and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.” ‘For many are invited, but few are chosen.’

Reflections on Stewardship (II)

In the readings this morning we are reminded of the generosity of God, even when God's people choose to act in ways that seem to discount what is offered, as we see in the Exodus story when the people follow Aaron and the local gods all because Moses is a bit late. But even so the promise is restated that the people of God will find the promised land and abundance will flow. Paul urges his readers to think on those things that are praiseworthy, and in Matthew Jesus talks of a wedding banquet quite like none other where all are welcome, and those who are there for the wrong reasons will find be found out. In reflecting upon stewardship the focus in this context is on the individual, because individuals have relationships with others and form communities. We use the word 'currency' in most instances to refer to money, and stewardship is concerned with money and resources, but the word also refers to prevalence and the concept of 'Holy Currencies' (Law, 2014, Chalice Press) is relevant here. Holy Currencies underpin the way we live out our lives in company with God endeavouring to be true to the way that Jesus has shown. It has been suggested that there are seven Holy Currencies that need to be addressed as good stewards: The *Currency of Relationship*, which encompasses establishing new relationships with others outside the church community and

strengthening relationships within the church; the *Currency of Truth*, encourages exploration and examination of self, the church, and the wider community; the *Currency of Time*, refers to the time given to ministry activities in the Church beyond worship time and time allocated for ministry in the wider community; the *Currency of Place*, is about assisting in preparing the church property to sustain ministry, and/or offering space for ministry activities beyond the church; the *Currency of Gracious Leadership*, which refers to the way how we participate in leadership and train or mentor others in ministry leadership; the *Currency of Wellness*, refers to physical wellness, social wellness and the enhancement of ecological wellness of the community; the *Currency of Money*, which addresses the financial needs of the church through regular giving, and participating in fund raising for ministry projects, in addition to attending to our spending choices and the impact that can follow. Stewardship then refers to a whole of life approach and urges God's people to examine and to commit to these Holy Currencies for the benefit of the self as well as the community of faith and the people we seek to serve.
