




Anglican Parish of Kilmore, Broadford, Pyalong and Tallarook

THE COLLECT

Faithful God, you have appointed us your witnesses, to be a light that shines in the world: let us not hide the bright hope you have given us, but tell everyone your love, revealed in Jesus Christ the Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of prophet Isaiah 58.1 - 9a

¹ Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins. 2 Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practised righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgements, they delight to draw near to God. 3 'Why do we fast, but you do not see? Why humble ourselves, but you do not notice?' Look, you serve your own interest on your fast-day, and oppress all your workers. 4 Look, you fast only to quarrel and to fight and to strike with a wicked fist. Such fasting as you do today will not make your voice heard on high. 5 Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord? ⁶ Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? ⁷ Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? 8 Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rearguard. ⁹ Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am.

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm: 112

Said/Sung: A Light Rises in the Darkness

¹ O praise the Lord. Blessed are they fear the Lord: and greatly delight in his commandments. ² Their children shall be mighty in the land: an upright race who will be blessed. ³ Riches and plenty shall be in their house: and their righteousness

shall stand for ever. ⁴ Light arises in darkness for the upright: gracious and merciful are the righteous. ⁵ It goes well with those who act generously and lend: who guide their affairs with justice...R

⁶ Surely they shall never be moved: the righteous shall be held in everlasting remembrance. ⁷ They will not fear bad tidings: their hearts are steadfast, trusting in the Lord. ⁸ Their hearts are confident and will not fear: they will see the downfall of their enemies. ⁹ They give freely to the poor: their righteousness stands for ever, their head is uplifted in glory. ¹⁰ The wicked shall see it and be angry: they shall gnash their teeth and consume away; and the hope of the wicked shall fail...R *Silence may follow each reading.*

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians Chapter 2.1 - 13

¹ When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. ² For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. ³ And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. 4 My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, ⁵ so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God. ⁶ Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. ⁷ But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. 8 None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. 9 But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him'— 10 these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. 11 For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. 12 Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. ¹³ And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹³ 'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. ¹⁴ 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. ¹⁷ 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil. ¹⁸ For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

Let us pray: Put a right heart within us, O God; hear us and answer when we call upon you.

God of all justice, you desire of your people righteousness and truth: hear us when we pray for the peoples of the world. We pray for all who are exploited and oppressed, those whose land and livelihood have been taken away. Put a right heart within us, that we may work to bring freedom to the oppressed, release to the captive, dignity and justice to all your people. (pause) God of all mercy, hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.

God of holiness, you desire of your people obedience and integrity: hear us when we pray for your church. We pray for all who belong to the community of faith, for Philip, our Archbishop and Clarence, our Bishop elect, for all who are prophets, priest or pastors to your people, for all who worship in this parish. Put a right heart within us, that our lives may be a sacrifice acceptable in your eyes, a light to draw others to your presence. (pause) God of all mercy, hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.

God of all love, you desire of your people generosity and kindness: hear us when we pray for those in need. We pray for those without food or shelter, for the

unemployed and for all whom we push to the edges of society. Put a right heart within us, that we may share what we have with the hungry and the poor, the homeless and all who are without hope. (pause) God of all mercy, hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.

God of all compassion, you desire of your people tenderness and care: hear us when we pray for all in trouble or distress: We pray for the lonely and those without family or friends, for those who grieve for lost love ones and for all who are sick or in pain. (pause) God of all mercy, hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.

Rest eternal grant to them O Lord **and let light perpetual shine upon them**. We give thanks for all good and holy people whose lives have shone with the light of your truth. Put a right heart within us, that in life we may follow in their footsteps and in death we may be brought with them to the place that you prepare for all who love you. (pause) God of all mercy, **hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.**

In a time of silence let us pray for ourselves and those on our hearts and minds this day... (pause) God of all mercy, hear our prayer and let our cry come unto you.

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
