# The Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary

#### **Sentence**

Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word. (Luke 1:38)

#### The Collect

We beseech you, O Lord, pour your grace into our hearts, that, as we have known the incarnation of your Son Jesus Christ by the message of an angel, so by his cross and passion we may be brought to the glory of his resurrection; who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

### **First Reading**

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah, chapter 7, beginning at verse 10.

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights.' But Ahaz said, 'I will not ask; I will not put the Lord to the test.' Then Isaiah said, 'Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

## Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 40: v.6-13

R: I have declared your righteousness in the great congregation.

O Lord my God, great are the wonderful things which you have done, and your thoughts which are towards us: there is none to be compared with you; Were I to declare them and speak of them: they are more than I am able to express. **R...**

## **Second Reading**

A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, chapter 10, beginning at verse 4.

It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said: 'Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. Then I said, "Here I am – it is written about me in the scroll – I have come to do your will, my God." First he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them' – though they were offered in accordance with the law. Then he said, 'Here I am, I have come to do your will.' He sets aside the first to establish the second. And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

## **The Gospel Acclamation**

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants for ever; his kingdom will never end.' 'How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, 'since I am a virgin?' The angel answered, 'The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. For no word from God will ever fail.' 'I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. 'May your word to me be fulfilled.' Then the angel left her.

## **Thoughts for the Week**

There is a public sphere, and there is a private sphere. A key issue with society today is the blurring and misconstrual of the two. Over the years, religion has been relegated further and further into the private sphere, when in fact Christianity by its very nature is evangelistic and apostolic; that is, we are sent by the gospel to proclaim the gospel. Ergo, the proper place for Christianity is in the public sphere. Not just in terms of gathering and preaching and praying, but in the practice of social justice, the literal feeding and advocacy of the poor. If we are helping each other, we must recognise that this is in the name and strength of Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Morality is not something we just invented one day, it is a hallmark of God, which separates human beings from the base 'creeping things' upon the earth. It is a gift of God, to be embraced and praised and exercised as such. Love of the Lord (agape') is something for the public sphere. Love of another human individual (eros, philia) is meant for the private sphere. Not because there is anything wrong with the former two, but rather to retain the sanctity of these human relationships. It has become more and more of a problem with the advancement of social media. Relationships are lived in the public eye, and all sense of the sacred is removed. They become more about physicality, physical attraction, than the exercise of love. Furthermore, a relationship lived in the public eye is done so to elicit sensations like jealousy, pride and sympathy that are counterintuitive to the journey and purpose of the relationship itself. The point is not to shout to the world, 'look how good my life is', because we run the risk of inferring, 'my life is better than yours'. Such mantras seem innocent at first, but can morph over time into the likes of, 'I can get other people to do whatever I want'; a blatant misuse of the gift of love. A partner is someone you support in your own way, time and space, with reciprocity, in sanctity and privacy. The love of the Lord is public because, by contrast, you want to invite others into that relationship. It is an artifact which deepens with increased population; a phenomenon which renders the artifact of sacred human relationship superficial and empty, the more people who are 'in on it'. Know what is meant to be public, and what is meant to be private.
