The Collect

Almighty God, your Son Jesus Christ has taught us that what we do for the least of his brothers and sisters we also do for him: give us the will to serve others as he was the servant of all, who gave up his life and died for us; yet lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

First Reading

A reading from the book of Genesis, chapter 24, beginning at verse 34. So he said, 'I am Abraham's servant. The Lord has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. And Sarah my master's wife bore a son to my master when she was old; and he has given him all that he has. My master made me swear, saying, "You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live; but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son." 'I came today to the spring, and said, "O Lord, the God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going! I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, 'Please give me a little water from your jar to drink,' and who will say to me, 'Drink, and I will draw for your camels also'—let her be the woman whom the Lord has appointed for my master's son." 'Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water-jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, "Please let me drink." She guickly let down her jar from her shoulder, and said, "Drink, and I will also water your camels." So I drank, and she also watered the camels. Then I asked her, "Whose daughter are you?" She said, "The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's son, whom Milcah bore to him." So I put the ring on her nose, and the bracelets on her arms. Then I bowed my head and worshipped the Lord, and blessed the Lord, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left.' And they called Rebekah, and said to her, 'Will you go with this man?' She said, 'I will.' So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. And they blessed Rebekah and said to her, 'May you, our sister, become thousands of myriads; may your offspring gain possession of the gates of their foes.' Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way. Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi, and was settled in the Negeb. Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field; and looking up, he saw camels coming. And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel, and said to the servant, 'Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?' The servant said, 'It is my master.' So she took her veil and covered herself. And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done. Then Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent. He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death. Hear the word of the Lord.

Second Reading

A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans, chapter 7, beginning at verse 14. For we know that the law is spiritual; but I am of the flesh, sold into slavery under sin. I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin. Hear the word of the Lord.

Thoughts for the Week

Relationships are hard work. Making initial connections can be even harder. I'm convinced the world is becoming more and more introverted, and more certainly introspective. Spirituality, or should I say trends in spirituality are increasingly more about looking inward, as though frantically repairing a damaged hull, before the outside seeps in and the vulnerable inner workings are exposed. I understand that spiritual practices help us to do self-maintenance; that's the very idea of them. But my question is always this: maintaining yourself to do what exactly? Inner peace is only viable if you yourself can be a vessel of peace for others. Not just you. Life isn't a permanent coffee break, with earbuds in, a blanket on and a nice puzzle before you. Vehicles weren't made to sit idle, they were made to travel and transport things. To be of mobile service to various users. Consider yourself a vehicle of peace, rather than an ornament of peace. You were meant to be driven, not to sit and gather dust. Spiritual practices prepare you to deal with everything that life throws at you. And indeed, these practices become much more helpful when you can share them. This is the core of evangelism, the sharing of how to be a vehicle of peace when chaos reigns around us. The movement of the Holy Spirit is experiential, not theoretical. Neither is it a collectible to put on one's mantle, but a dynamic intention of God's will, to propagate and grow. Spiritual practice makes you alive, in order that you may resonate and give life to others.
